President's Report:

- Back to School Bash: great turnout, thanks to all who helped, including the AV staff and parents, lots of volunteers signed up for activities
- PTC President's Meeting: the school board has 2 student reps from GC; chosen from a pool of 40 who went through an interview process; they will give a report at the Board meeting and work with elementary schools student reps.
- Congratulations to Arbor View social worker Kim Wankel, librarian Joy Yerly, and parent
 partner Kim Carbonneau on receiving a PEP grant. Wankel and Yerly will purchase a set
 of books centered on mindfulness to aid students in self management, social awareness,
 making responsible decisions, and relationship skills. The books will be used in
 social-emotional classroom lessons and will be available for students to check out from
 the library.
- Surplus of 1.5 million from the referendum that will even out the deficit the district faced; the board will not have to renew bonds and will run on budget, including 10% rainy day fund.
- Enrollment is going up; there are 80 new students over what was projected. 2300 students in the district; all teacher jobs filled
- Glenbard Parent Series: this is an amazing resource that is free of charge to attend; flyers went home, extras in the office
- There was a district fundraiser at Buona Beef; the money raised will go to the PEP fund
- District 89 foundation: Rep needed from AV, looking for a two year commitment, meetings once a month, PEP fund will be the fiscal recipient
- Parents night out the end of February district wide to fund the PEP fund
- GC had a back to school bbg Sept. 9
- The Amazing Race at GC was great
- Briar Glen gave every teacher \$1000 to buy books for each classroom from PTC fundraisers; giving teacher grants with the remaining \$4400
