- 2. Approval of Minutes- Last meeting minutes were approved
- 3. Superintendent Emily Tammaru Dr. Tammaru shared some public information.
 - The School Board is in the process of completing an equity audit. Progress was shared.
 - Strategic plan will be updated community members (parents, residents, staff) are invited.
 - Soon- registration (21-22) a new payment schedule will be coming (My School Bucks). Additionally, 'Power School' will be for school/district communication. More information to come.

- 4. Kim Wankel (& Joy Yerly) Namaste Family Wellness Night- Thurs. March 19, 6-8 pm @ AV- Mrs. Wankel shared the background of the event. This event is a result of a PEP grant (\$500) that was obtained my Mrs. Wankel, Mrs. Yerly and Mrs. Carbonneau. The purpose of applying for this grant was to be proactive in supporting students/families as their stress levels have notably increased over the years. The money received from the grant was used for books in the library and for activities that would benefit all students. The books are used for classroom lessons, kids can check out the books and for Family Literacy Night. The students receive mini-lessons in class and parents can be introduced to the books that are now available in the Arbor View Library. The Wellness Night at Arbor View is an opportunity for families to learn ways to regulate different emotions and help support their child in learning ways to self-regulate their BIG emotions. Other topics offered during that evening are: Mindful eating/healthy food options, yoga, reading therapy dogs, art, reading on the various topics of mindfulness, gratitude journaling, and meditation. PTC is asked to provide water, snacks and \$150 to go towards tangible supplies for the evening. Motion by Jay Lerch, second by Keri Poi motion approved.
