1. Call to Order – Called to order 7:03pm
2. Approval of Minutes – November minutes approved 7:03pm
3. President's Report – Stephanie Furlong
 - a. D89 PTC meeting hasn't happened since November, but there is one later this month
 - b. Mom Prom Carnival on Saturday, 1/28, at Glen Crest. Every school needs a volunteer, and we still need one for Arbor View
 - c. Dr. Tammaru moving to be superintendent to Northbrook school district after this year. She has been with D89 since 2016. The district has already begun the search for a new superintendent
 - There will be 2 community forms with HCA (which is the org handling the search), online survey, and ~20 focus groups with various groups (teachers, PTC, staff, etc). They want everyone in the community – whether you have children in D89 schools or not
 - d. Registration for 2023 tuition pre-school is open now through February 27th
 - e. Kindergarten registration is in February
 - f. Safe to Help is new resource where students/families can report bullying and threats
 - g. Feb 9th at noon or 6pm – community discussion with Dr. Tammaru on academic interventions that D89 does to support struggling learners in the district
